Legal Process

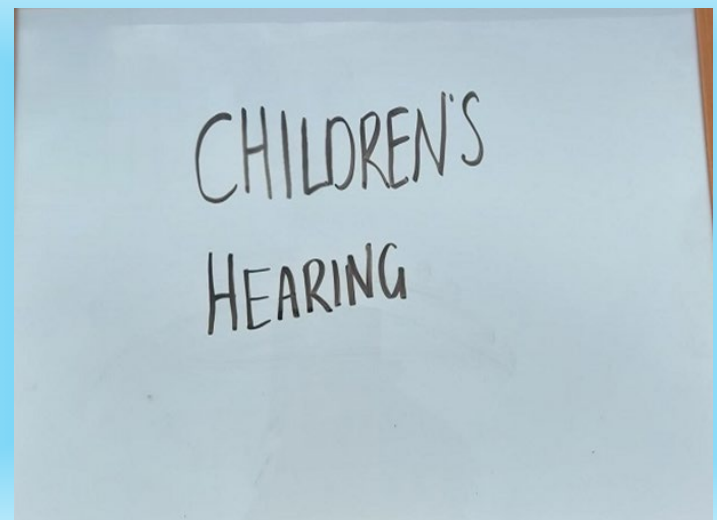

I felt it was a negative outlook on me

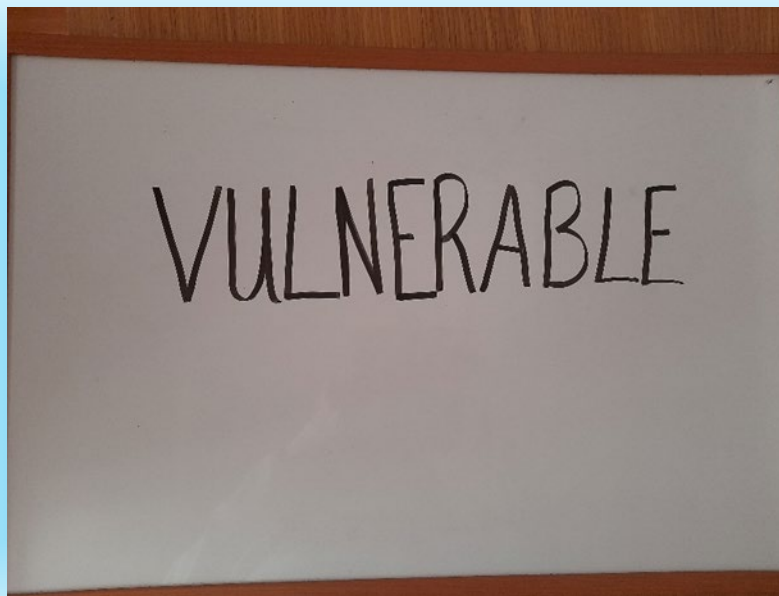
Upset

Why can non care experienced people say brothers and sisters but we aren't allowed to say that in a formal setting?

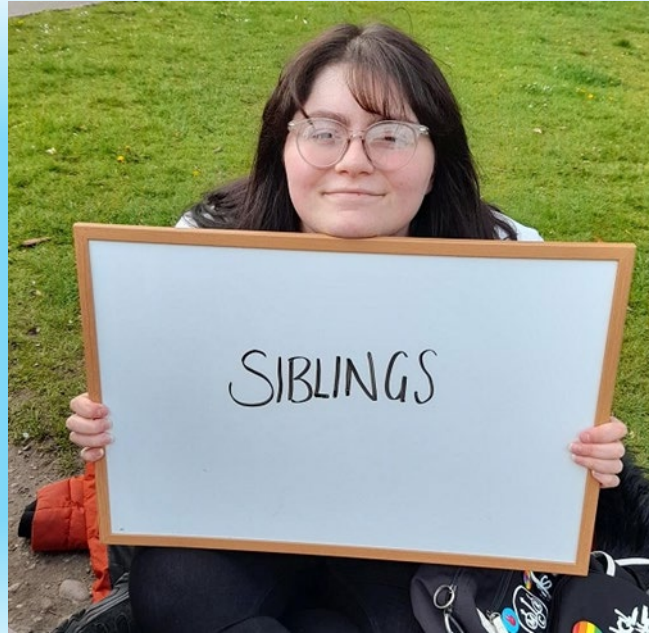
Together

The word placement is very professional. When people used placements with me, it made me feel like I didn't belong and I was being forced to go there.

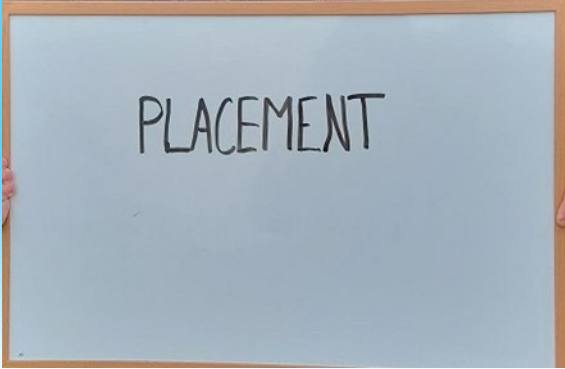
Should just be the name of the place where you're going.
