### BUDGET REALITY = THIS BUDGET REPRESENTS **A CUT OF** <u>**£100m**</u> TO REVENUE FUNDING FOR COUNCILS (WHEN COMPARED TO 21/22)

(Cash increase presented (£791.4m) *less* commitments/pressures (£891m) = **£100m**)

NOTE: Revenue funding for Early Learning and Childcare expansion has been reduced by £15m in this year's revenue funding settlement, when compared to the final year of the multi year funding package for expansion (21/22)

NOTE: Revenue funding for the expansion has **not yet** been included in the Local Government Settlement
